School Fees 2016 - \$160 per child

Deputy Principals' Report

Harmony Day – Monday, 21 March 2016

On Monday 21 March, students are encouraged to wear a splash of orange to help recognise Harmony Day. They still wear their school uniform but can accessorise with a splash of orange by wearing items such as orange headbands, socks, hair ties etc.

Robotics at LPS - 2016



Students in the Robotics group have started building their rescue robots using the new LEGO EV3 Mindstorms kits. This year, the school has purchased eight new EV3 robots to replace the old model NXT robots that the school has been using since robotics started at LPS in 2007. This year is the tenth year that the Robotics Club has been running. In that time, hundreds of students have learnt to program NXT robots using the Mindstorms visual programming language. This year, the students are working toward the Robocup Junior competition at UNSW in August. The students will be mentored by Ms Jane DeValle, Ms Renee Liddell, Mr Daniel Smith and Mr Peter Brock during the sessions that run before and after school. We thank these teachers for giving up their time before and after school to support such a worthwhile extra-curricular activity.

Cricket Knockout

Last Wednesday Mr Smith and the Senior A cricket team travelled to Castle Hill for the first round of the State Knock-Out cricket tournament, played against Oakhill Drive Public School. The conditions were perfect for a day of cricket, with a quick pitch and well-manicured outfield, the only negative being the blistering heat the teams played through. Oakhill Drive won the toss, electing to bowl first. Lindfield's opening batsmen struggled to score in the first session, with the outfield still damp with morning dew. After drinks, Will M and Mack A came out and scored many quick singles, finally getting the run rate back on track for Lindfield. A number of quick wickets for Oakhill Drive had Lindfield on edge, but the run rate remained steady and at the end of the first innings, Lindfield was 6/102, a respectable score considering the rapidly increasing heat.



After lunch, Oakhill Drive started the second innings with a bang, notching up 21 runs in just the first overs! The Lindfield spectators seemed worried for a short period of time, but the blistering pace of the Lindfield bowling order proved too strong for the Oakhill Drive attack. Successive wickets from seven of Lindfield's bowlers toppled the Oakhill Drive order, and at drinks the opposition were 5/38. This worried Lindfield's courageous captain Hugo P, as Lindfield had been 1/40 at the same point in the first innings. His worries were soon quelled after drinks, with four quick wickets and five blinding maiden overs. Oakhill Drive finished the innings with a respectable score of 9/67.

The final score for the day was; Lindfield 6/102 defeating Oakhill Drive 9/67. This means the team now moves onto round two of the State Knockout Tournament, against either Lane Cove Public School or Lane Cove West Public School. Mr Smith would like to thank the parent helpers that were available on the day and the team for displaying excellent sportsmanship during and after the match.

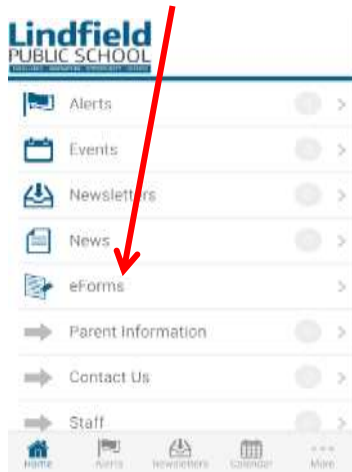

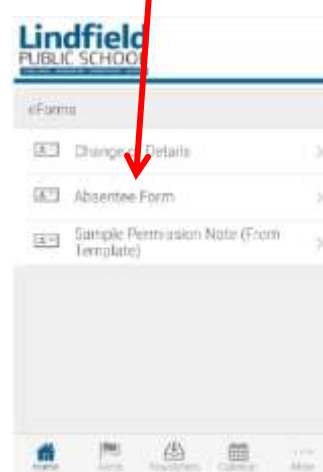

It is a wonderful opportunity for participants to improve their performance skills and bring back the benefits for the whole of our band.

Students from NSW Government schools have been attending State Music Camps for more than 60 years. Talented music students join together for one week each year to receive expert tutelage and develop their performance skills. Participants rehearse and perform high quality repertoire culminating in a concert for families and friends on the final night of the camp.

Musical activities at camp include participation in a major ensemble (symphony orchestra, symphonic bands, vocal ensembles, rock band and saxophone ensemble) as well as a number of elective ensembles and activities. Elective activities include brass and woodwind ensembles, stage band, jazz improvisation, composition, music technology, music theatre, music and movement.

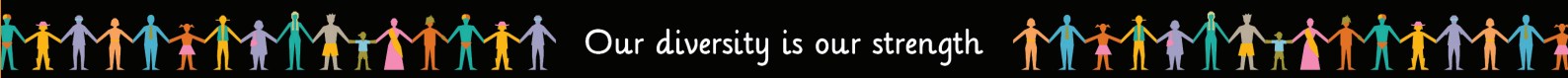
