


Year 6 Muck Up Photo





Anaphylaxis at Lindfield Public School

At Lindfield Public School in 2016, we have a small number of children with a potentially life threatening allergic reaction. They are found across our school from Kindergarten to Year 6.

How can parents help these children?

- If possible, choose alternative sandwich spreads to peanut butter and Nutella. If you have no alternative, inform your child that these foods can trigger an anaphylactic reaction.
- Reinforce the school's **NO FOOD SHARING** message.

Robocup

Lindfield PS Robotics at the Robocup NSW Open

On Friday and Saturday of Week 6, 23 students from the LPS Robotics Club competed at the RoboCup Junior Australia held at the University of New South Wales. LPS had 8 teams of students competing in Primary Rescue category. The teams have been preparing in weekly sessions since Term 1 and have also had Saturday sessions this term.

The LPS teams worked well, assisting each other solve problems and refining their programs. LPS teams competed against 40 other primary school teams. After two long days and many rounds, two LPS teams were in the top four before the finals. The winning team was Team Celery (Finn G, Harry W., Kailash S, Kian S) with Godzillas (James W, Darren B, Justin L) placing fourth.

The challenge is based on the concept of rescuing a victim from a chemical spill after a natural disaster where there is no direct path to the victim. It involves programming a LEGO Mindstorms EV3 robot to autonomously follow a line representing a maze to reach a victim (silver soft drink can) in a chemical spill (a green tile) and push the victim out of the spill to safety. Along the way the robot may encounter obstacles such as; a water tower, bridge, speed bumps, hills and a see-saw section of track. To navigate, the robot had to detect a black line using colour/light sensors, detect green flags to change directions, sense obstacles using an ultrasonic sensor and avoid the obstacles. The entire rescue process is time limited to 120 seconds in which the students' robot may need to travel a distance up to 5 metres.

The students are to be commended on their determination, resilience and patience as they completed the rounds and finals. They listened carefully to constructive feedback given by the officials and raced off to make any necessary adjustments. They did not lose their cool when their robots encountered problems and supported each other with assistance and advice to show the true meaning of teamwork.

The following link will take you to video footage taken as Team Celery worked their way through Round 2 of the tricky, multi-level course created for the finals! The orange puck seen in the video is the place nominated by the contestant where the robot can restart if they encounter difficulty in the run.



In Term 4 the Canteen will be offering manual and online ordering. This does not mean you have to put your order in online as it is each family's choice as to whether they put their order in manually to the canteen as they do now or place their order online.

Canteen Large Lunch Bags.

It is very difficult to fit more than a couple of things in the brown lunch bags when packing them. The canteen sells larger bags (\$4.50 for 50 or \$8.00 for 100) which are much easier to pack. Father's Day 2016. The playoffs for the Australian Schools Teams Championships at Knox Grammar. A lovely, warm spring Sunday. Just pop in for an hour with my preschooler to see the girls learn chess notation on the fly, watch them start and be home in a jiffy. No sweat. After all at this level games don't go for more than 10 minutes, 20 minutes tops. So what were we doing there five hours later? Read on and find out.

This year LPS Chess has a very young team nominated to have a go at representing NSW for Primary Girls at the Australian Schools Teams Championships. Previously we've offered up Year 6 girls trained for years and years to reach the pinnacle of Primary Girl's Chess. This year three of our team only started last year (our team comprising a Year 5, a Year 4 and two Year 3's.) Mind you, some of our opponents from Summer Hill PS looked even smaller! They fielded a Year 3 and a very small but determined looking Year 1 with a Year 6 and Year 5!

We were so unprepared we had to arrange for the girls to come a little early to learn how to notate their games (this is akin to learning advanced programming for novice Robotics people - possible, but very tough.) That done, our prep speech 'We are very proud of you, do try hard, no giggling but do have fun' and the organisers speech 'When the first round finishes we will take a short break and we should be finished by 12' got the girls off and going.



In the next room was the playoffs for high school - comprising James Ruse, North Sydney Boys, Sydney Boys and Knox. The absolute best chess juniors in the state and amongst the brightest kids in the state, including ex-LPS Joshua in Board 1 for North Sydney, who lost his Queen early in his first match and yet somehow mesmerised his opponent for an amazing win.

So, stay for 10 minutes and head off. Somehow we forgot that. 40 minutes later and all 4 matches are still going and some are close. After an hour 3 matches are finished - Jannah and Emily winning

(Boards 1 and 2) and Consuela losing (Board 4.)

And here it went really really off script, as Ameya and her opponent played an epic where neither player was strong enough to identify winning moves (the game could have been finished 20 times over) and yet neither lost focus or would give way. An hour. Two. Then 2 and a half hours later Ameya is finally, grudgingly and stubbornly, defeated. The game had gone for longer than the high school matches (some about 2 hours) with well over 100 moves, at one stage with 7 people hovering over and staring at the game. No pressure....

Round 1 - 2-2 draw. So that led towards the second round....

'Ameya, you've played for three hours on one game. It is your birthday and there are 18 families for a Father's Day lunch. It is 1:15pm and you are really late. We can forfeit your match if you want (if Emily and Jannah win again it should be ok) or you can try to play for a few minutes and then withdraw.'

Ameya: 'No I want to play.'

'You sure? Alright - go on all out attack and if it becomes even more late we can withdraw you'.

Ameya: 'I'll do the 4 move checkmate.'

She didn't take the 4 moves - she took 6.

Her (Year 1) opponent peered up from the board she was staring at intently: 'Are you the same player I just played?'

The other games took quite a while - Jannah won hers, and Emily and Consuela lost theirs. The final score was a 4-4 draw but on tie-break (removing games starting from Board 4) we won 4-4 (4-2.) Somehow our young team scraped through and won the right to represent NSW in December in Perth! And we were wrong again - Ameya's second match was critical.

After the match - Consuela: 'I lost both my games....'

'No - you were also critical to this match. Without you here today losing both matches we would not have a team and not be here. Without you playing week in, week out losing every match...' 'No I won some matches.' '...we would not be here. So we needed you.'

The girls learnt a lot about focus, the importance of giving it a go and that sometimes when you 'lose', you are actually a winner. To even be there was amazing and to win - incredible. Congratulations girls - we are really proud of you.

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
