Classes and Staffing for 2018

As the end of the school year draws near, we are in full swing for planning for next year. We are currently installing two demountables and organising staffing.

When students return next year, they will be placed in temporary or holding classes until we can ascertain our final numbers. Our numbers are changing daily! Once this is done, we can finalise the class structures and move into permanent classes. We expect this process to take only a few days. During this time, all children will be actively involved in lessons around road safety, friendships and antibullying as well as returning to the study of English, Maths, Science, PD/H/PE and Creative Arts. This year, teachers have commenced planning for class formation with 32 classes across the school. Class structure is determined by the number of students in each grade and the staffing formula associated with this. We may have a range of composite classes and straight classes across the school. Our teachers are well equipped to differentiate the curriculum to cater for these classes. Our staffing is still being finalised and next year we will see a range of staffing combinations as some teachers will be returning from Maternity Leave and some teachers will be taking leave. There will be some classes with job shares- meaning two teachers teaching the class for set days each week.

First Day Next year - 2018

Next year, students in Years 1-6 will commence school on Tuesday 30 January. Kindergarten will attend their Best Start Interview on 30, 31 January or 1 February and then commence full days of school on Friday 2 February.

Thank you parents and carers for all the support you have given our school this year. Your generosity in giving up your time to assist in classrooms, on committees and helping out in so many ways, is appreciated. Special thanks go to those parents and carers who are leaving us this year – thank you for your contributions over the years.

City Country Alliance Leadership Summit: Wednesday 22 - Friday 24 November

During Week 7 of the school term, Mr Smith and the school leaders Will, Freya, Max and Claire attended the inaugural City Country Alliance Leadership Summit. The summit was based on Cockatoo Island and the group was lucky to attend a plethora of events in and around Sydney. Many keynote speakers attended the conference and presented incredible stories of their lives, including Professor Dame Marie Bashir, Dr Leanne Holt, Members of Parliament Gareth Ward and Jihad Dib, the ever inspirational Lorin Nicholson and a number of speakers at Belmore Boys High School. The students developed an increased intercultural understanding and respect for diversity over the span of the three days, from both the key note speakers and the many different tours and experiences they were given.

The trip started bright and early on the Wednesday morning, with Mr Smith meeting the students at 5:30am at Lindfield Station for the train ride to Circular Quay. From here the group boarded a ferry to Cockatoo Island where they would spend the next two nights camping and glamping! The first day was a very fast paced day of tours, eye opening experiences and moving around the city of Sydney, with speeches from Professor Dame Marie Bashir, seeing Question Time in the New South Wales State Parliament, an Aboriginal Heritage tour of the Rocks and culminating in a dinner in the revolving restaurant in Sydney Tower. The group was exhausted as they retired to their tents and the neverending sound of seagulls!

Thursday began with a guided tour of Cockatoo Island, where the students learnt about the history of the island and how it had been utilised in a number of different ways over the years. Following the tour, the students were lucky enough to see Lorin Nicholson's inspirational presentation where he discussed the hardships of living with a disability, inspiring the students with his words. The rest of Thursday was a whirlwind experience of Western Sydney, including an eye opening visit to Lakemba Mosque, tour of Greenacre Public School and finishing with an incredible visit to Belmore Boys High School. This visit ended with an authentic Lebanese dinner and presentations from Hazem El Masri, Dr Zacharia Mathews and the Principal Ms Ramadan. These speakers discussed the everyday challenges faced by refugees when arriving in Australia and the problems being a refuge caused both socially, financially and professionally. It was a very interesting evening for our school leaders!

Friday saw the group up bright and early to have breakfast and pack before departing Cockatoo Island for the last time to head to Sydney Olympic Park. When we arrived at Olympic Park we were treated to a tour of the Western Sydney Giants AFL team's headquarters and training facilities. After the tour it was time to jump on the train and return to school!

Mr Smith would like to thank Will, Freya, Max and Claire for their exemplary behaviour during the summit and exceptional way in which they represented Lindfield Public School. We are so lucky to have such incredible leaders!

- 1. Go to www.kookaburra.com.au/login
- 2. Enter User Name: LINDF003 (The first 5 characters are letters and the last 3 characters are numbers) and password: studentpack (lowercase)
- 3. Select Student Packs.
- 4. Select your student's 2018 Year Level.
- 5. Add the quantity next to products required by your child, in the "Quantity box".
- 6. When you are satisfied with your selection, click on "Add selected items to cart".
- 7. If you have another child to shop for, select their 2018 Year Level from the drop down and add items to your cart.
- 8. When you've finished shopping for your child/ren, click on the cart icon in the header to go to the cart and complete your order.
- 9. Once you are satisfied with your order, click on "Continue to Checkout" at the bottom of this page. (Please note: all orders are Firm Sale i.e. non-returnable).
- 10. Select a Delivery Method from the drop-down list provided online and complete your delivery details as required.
- 11. **Note:** If home delivery is available for your school, please ensure someone will be available to receive the goods at time of delivery. All home deliveries require a signature, unless you have provided an Authority to Leave (ATL). 






Medical Alert Updates 2017


