I am looking forward to our Presentation Assemblies in the School Hall next week where we will acknowledge the achievements of students. All students should wear their full summer school uniform with shiny black shoes and white socks for girls and grey socks for boys.

#### **Computer Science Education Week**

All LPS students are participating in the 'Hour of Code' as part of the Computer Science Education Week. During the year, students in Years 3 and 4 learn to use Scratch, a graphical programming language. Stage 3 students use the Australian Computing Academy Digital Technologies challenges where Year 5 students learn to use the Blockly graphical programming language and Year 6 students use the text based general purpose programming language Python. Our Year 6 students are well prepared for the new Digital Technologies curriculum that will start in 2019 as they enter High School. 
We will be selling lettuce, cabbage and a variety of herbs.





- If possible, choose alternative sandwich spreads to peanut butter and Nutella. If you have no alternative, inform your child that these foods can trigger an anaphylactic reaction.
- Reinforce the school's NO FOOD SHARING message.

Please note, no students are allowed to bring glass bottles to school for safety reasons

It gives goose bumps to a flower stem.



# Introducing the School Opal card

The School Opal card gives eligible students free or discounted travel between home and school using the train, bus, ferry and light rail services you nominate in your application.

#### Who can apply?

To be eligible for a School Opal card, students may need to live a minimum distance from their school:

#### Years K-2 (Infants)

There's no minimum distance.

#### Years 3-6 (Primary)

More than 1.6km straight line distance or at least 2.3km walking.

#### Years 7-12 (Secondary)

More than 2.0km straight line distance or at least 2.9km walking.



If you live too close to be eligible for free travel, you may still qualify for a School Term Bus Pass, which offers travel on buses between home and school at a discounted rate for the whole school term.

#### Who needs to apply

A new application is only required if the student has not had a School Opal card before.

If the student already has a School Opal card and is changing schools, campuses or home address, you will need to update their Opal card for the new school year before mid-December at apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts

#### How to apply

Applications for next year open at the start of Term 4 this year.

#### Step 1


Once the new school has confirmed your child's enrolment, complete the application at **transportnsw.info/school-students** 

#### Step 2

The school endorses your application.

#### Step 3

Once Transport for NSW has approved the application, a School Opal card will be sent to the address provided on the application.



Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 do not need to re-apply if they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have not been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <a href="https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails">https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails</a>

Applications need to be submitted **before 31 December 2018** to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2018, the system will automatically cancel a card and a new one will need to be issued. Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out during December 2018 and January 2019.

#### **Notice of Special General Meeting**

The P&C will be holding a (short) special general meeting on **Monday 17 December 2018** at **7:30pm** to deal with two items that need to be finalised before the end of the year.

- 1. **Approval of debit cards** (with a capped expenditure limit) for particular P&C staff (e.g. Canteen) so they are not out of pocket when purchasing supplies.
- 2. Amending the By-Law about sub-committee bank accounts to allow Swimming to have two committee signatories instead of one.

The formal change is to By-Law 17, which would have the words "and in the case of Swimming, two" added to it.

These are the only two items to be considered, so it is likely that the meeting will go for half an hour (or less).

Each of these items needs the approval of a P&C general meeting, and dealing with them in December will allow us to start the 2019 school year with these in place.




