
#### **Kindergarten Enrolments 2020**


# Parent Information and Kindergarten Orientation Visits Thursday 7 November and Thursday 14 November 2019 from 9:30am to 11:00am

While the children are visiting the Kindergarten classrooms, there will be information sessions for parents/carers in the School Hall.





Voucher one is valid January to December and voucher two is valid July to December. After 1 July 2019, the second voucher can be claimed immediately after the first voucher.
