Principal's Message

Helping Your Child with Reading

At last week's P&C Meeting, Miss Emily Morrow and Mr Peter Hayllar gave an informative presentation about the reading process and how to help your child with reading. In the early years, students are 'learning to read' and developing the mechanical processes such as phonics, decoding and using picture cues to read the text. In the later years, students are 'reading to learn'. By this time, they are using their reading skills to gain, analyse and synthesis information. Reading for pleasure always remains a key K-6 homework task as it builds vocabulary, fluency and



expression as well as enhances their writing skills. 'Pause, prompt and praise' is a wonderful strategy you can use to assist your child when reading aloud at home. Spare copies of the handouts are available from the office.

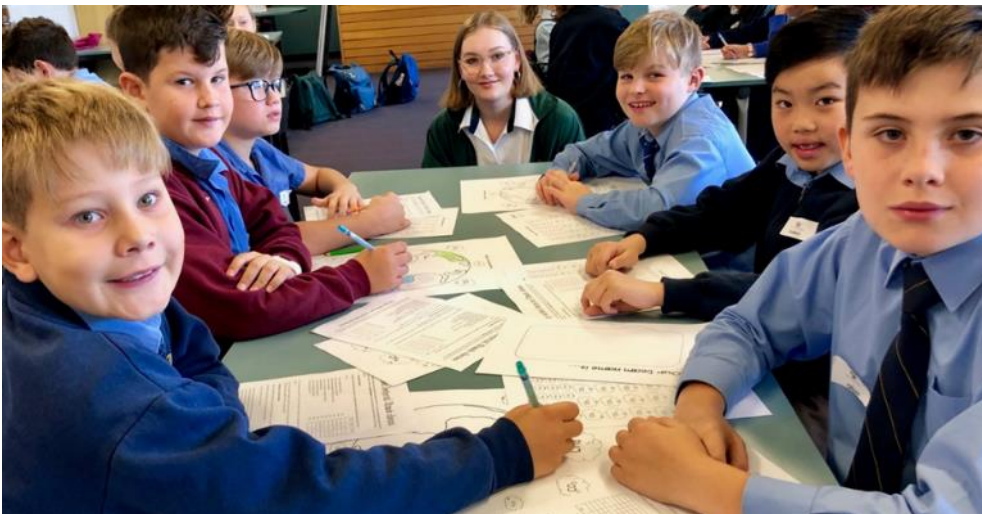

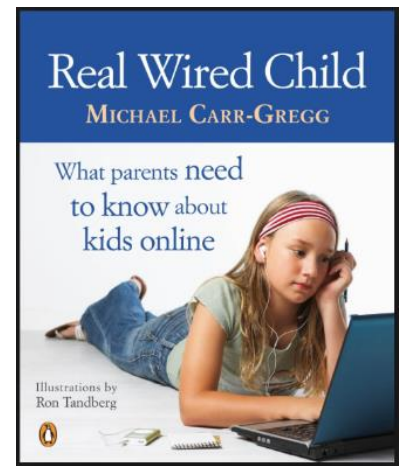
Dr Michael Carr-Gregg- 'The Real Wired Child'

Many of our parents attended the KSP Parent Information Evening last week presented by Dr Michael Carr-Gregg about 'The Real Wired Child'. He outlined his findings from his review of technology in schools and current research and gave some excellent tips about managing technology at home and school. He recommends 'It's Time We Talked'

<http://www.itstimewetalked.com.au/> as an excellent resource when dealing with inappropriate content from the internet. He also spoke about what to do when and not if, your child is cyberbullied. His tips are: 1. Don't respond 2. Save the evidence 3. Log off 4. Always tell your parents 5. Report it to the school 6. If criminal, report it to the Police.

Dr Carr-Gregg also gave the alarming statistic that 42% of primary children are contacted by a perfect stranger. He reminded parents that you are not your child's friend- you are the parent and your house, your rules! This may have been through online gaming, social media or iMessaging. His advice to parents:-1. No devices in the bedroom 2. Negotiate an online contract 3. Use an internet filtering system 4. Monitor and supervise your child on a device or computer 5. Know your child's passwords 6. Talk with your child regularly.

This was a very worthwhile and useful session.

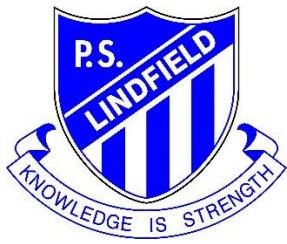


6R Assembly

Dear parents, guardians and carers

Re: Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the *NCCD guidelines (2019)*.

Information provided about students to the Australian Government for the NCCD includes:

- year of schooling
- category of disability: physical, cognitive, sensory or social/emotional
- level of adjustment provided: support provided within quality differentiated teaching practice, supplementary, substantial or extensive.

This information assists schools to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how they can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that they can review their learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.

The NCCD will have no direct impact on your child and your child will not be involved in any testing process. The school will provide data to the Australian Government in such a way that no individual student will be able to be identified – the privacy and confidentiality of all students is ensured. All information is protected by privacy laws that regulate the collection, storage and disclosure of personal information. 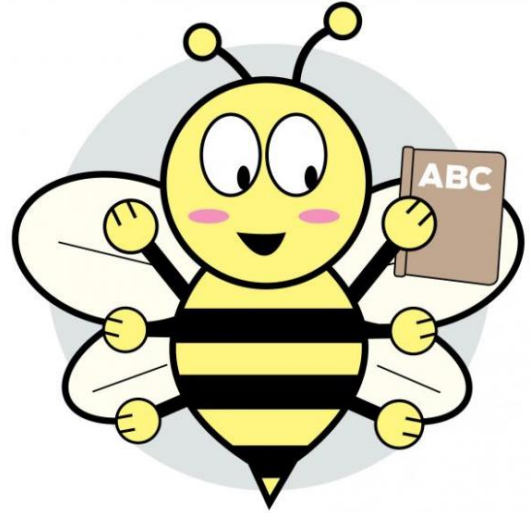

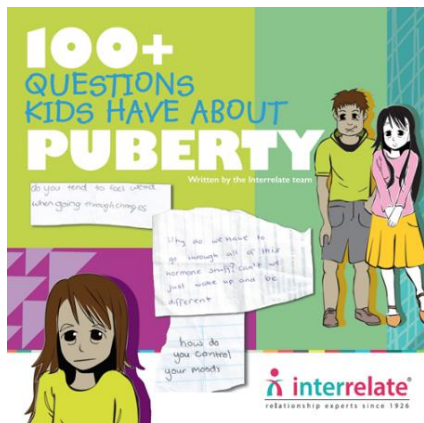
Premier's Spelling Bee

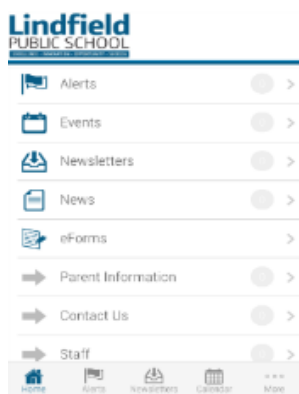

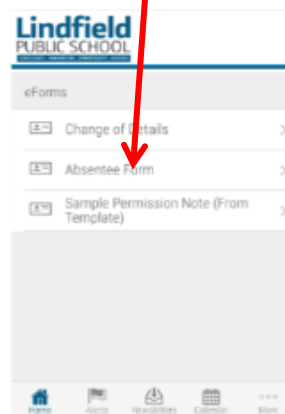
