Principal's Message

Mr Mark Scott Visits Lindfield PS

The Secretary of the NSW Department of Education, Mr Mark Scott, visited our school last Friday. Our School Captain Claire and Vice-Captain Max greeted him and welcomed him to our school sharing their experiences. Mr Scott then spent time in some classrooms speaking with students and teachers about how we are implementing 'Every student is known, valued and cared for' at LPS. This is a critical part of the NSW Department of Education and our school's Strategic Plan. He saw Growth Mindset, the Resilience Project, flexible learning spaces and writing lessons in action and he was impressed!



Water Safety Talks

Royal Life Saving NSW conducted Water Safety Talks for our Kindy and Years 3 and 4 students. Kindy learnt about how to be safe around water and how children should always be supervised by adults. They also role played how to help someone in trouble without endangering themselves.

Years 3 and 4 focussed on keeping safe in our inland waterways. They also learnt how to rescue someone if they fall overboard. The importance of wearing life jackets was stressed and students were given the opportunity to role play rescue techniques.

Today Kindy students will receive a duck and a magnet and Years 3 and 4 students will receive a tattoo set and magnet to remind them of the key messages covered in these sessions.



Stage 3 Social Media

The use of iMessage and Social Media tools on mobile phones and iPads is restricted within the school environment through our internet filtering and proxy settings. Under our school *'BYOD policy'* and the *'Department of Education Online Communication Services Acceptable Usage for School Students Policy'* students are aware that any breach will result in disciplinary action. Responsible use of the services by students, with guidance from teaching staff, will provide a secure and safe learning environment.

Year 3 and 4 Excursion to Giberagong

Over the last fortnight, students from Years 3 & 4 have taken part in an excursion at Gibberagong Environmental Education Centre in Ku Ring Gai Chase National Park. This excursion enhanced their learning of this semester's Science unit, 'Living World'. Students learnt about classifying native flora and fauna and how Indigenous people cared for their country. They took part in a guided bushwalk and had some exciting encounters with Australian native species.



Apple with Stage 3

During Term 1, Years 5 & 6 teachers will be introducing the 'Apple Classroom' application to manage the school iPad program and enhance student learning during BYOD. This application will help our teachers guide students with iPads through a lesson, see their progress and keep them on track. With 'Classroom', teachers have the ability to easily launch the same application on every student device at the same time, or launch a different app for each group of students. 'Classroom' helps teachers focus on teaching, so students can focus on learning. Students' use of their devices during a learning session is recorded and students are reminded of our School BYOD policy. We are looking forward to continuing our work with Apple Education and are providing all teachers with afternoon 'Tech and Tea' workshops in the near future.



Week 7: Wellbeing Week

Next week our school is focussing on student wellbeing and teaching our students strategies to stop bullying. The week begins with 'The Protectors', a show which gives children life lessons on being resilient and coping with adversity, especially in the area of bullying. Please see the flyer in Lines for more details of this production. Throughout the week, students will complete follow-up lessons in their classes to reinforce and embed strategies. Wellbeing Week will culminate on Friday, with our school taking part in the 'National Day of Action against Bullying and Violence'. Please reinforce the message to your children that bullying is never ok and how important it is to do something if you are experiencing or witnessing ongoing bullying.



MultiLit—Making up lost time in Literacy



MultiLit is a leader in effective literacy instruction in Australasia. Its programs are uniquely placed to be effective because they:

- have all been supported by scientific research;
- have been demonstrated to be effective;
- are comprehensive and balanced to suit the needs of each child.

Lindfield Public School has been running the successful MultiLit program since 2008. In that time trained volunteer tutors have been the mainstay of the program. MultiLit will be offered again this year to targeted Year 2 students who are experiencing difficulty in reading, discriminating sounds in words and do not have automatic recognition of sight words. **Training is provided** and you work one-on-one with a student.





At Lindfield Public School in 2019, we have a small number of children with a potentially life threatening allergic reaction. They are found across our school from Kindergarten to Year 6.


How can parents help these children?


