Principal's Message

Teachers are lifelong learners too!

Quality Teaching and Quality Teachers

Dr Julie Bowe from the University of Newcastle worked with teachers from Beaumont Road, Gordon East, Lindfield, Lindfield East and Roseville Public Schools, Auburn Girls and Killara High Schools on Quality Teaching Rounds (QTR). Research has shown the QTR is an extremely effective professional learning program for all teachers whether they are new to their profession or they are very experienced teachers.

Participating teachers found the process very informative especially when Dr Bowe covered the elements of the Quality Teaching Framework and explained what the elements e.g. deep knowledge, problematic knowledge, would look like in the classroom. The teachers had a practice session where they used their knowledge of the elements to code a lesson.

Following on from their training day, the teachers will be visiting one another's schools, observing each other and coding the lessons using the elements of the Quality Teaching Framework. They will also have professional discussions around these lessons.

Lindfield PS teachers involved included Mr Smith, Mrs Hamilton, Mrs Ball and Miss Knight. Our thanks go to Mr Sean Moran, Principal of Roseville Public School for hosting this Quality Teaching Rounds training day and Mrs Ann Dixon for coordinating this KSP event. These rounds will finish in Term 4 with a feedback session which all the Principals will attend.



Killara Schools Partnership Enrichment Workshops (written by Killara High School students and Mrs Ann Dixon)

Visual Arts – Year 4

Thirty-two Year 4 students from Lindfield, Lindfield East, Roseville and Killara Primary Schools attended Killara High School's annual art workshop, run by Ms Sherras and Ms Richards. The workshop taught skills of printmaking including how to use a printing press, silhouette and painting techniques. Assisting the workshop were talented Year 10 students.

In Ms Sherras' group, the students chose leaves as well as printed images then cut them out to form them into beautiful landscapes and garden scenes. Painting the blue sheets, they pressed them onto paper, placing them on the printing press. Once they were ready, they turned the printing press wheel, excited to see their finished products.

In Ms Richards' group the students learnt new techniques for painting and were excited to see the results that each silhouette revealed. They used leaves to make a forest print on their landscape paintings and to tie the whole painting together they added streaks of grass.

Each student created unique artworks that will be greatly appreciated in the Killara High School art show where their masterpieces will be shown off, learning skills that they will carry to high school, where they can be developed further, and their artistic abilities will grow.



Science – Year 3

Year 3 students from Lindfield Public School, joined Year 8 students at Killara High School for a Science workshop to carry out experiments aimed at developing observation skills. The workshop commenced with an exciting demonstration by the Head Teacher Science, Mr Aubusson as he mixed two substances and swirled the mixture around in a large conical flask, before dropping a match into it. The students found this particularly exciting as green flames erupted out of the flask. For the 'Baggy Science' the Year 3 students mixed a couple of powders and water to form a gas; an indicator was added to form a peach colored foam.

Lava lamps are mesmerizing to everyone who sees them. The students created their own by mixing oil and water with lots of food colouring. They observed and drew what they saw; they added an Alka-Seltzer tablet and observed what happened as the dye moved up and back down like a real lava lamp. The students were given the instructions to take home to their family so they could make one at home.

'Eggciting Air Pressure' was an experiment which starts with boiling water in a flask. The heat is turned off and the egg is then placed on top of the flask. Once it cools down the egg falls into the flask because of the air pressure.

The Year 3 students enjoyed their time at KHS just as much as the Year 8 students who helped them. All the experiments were enjoyable and assisted the Year 3 students in developing their observational skills.

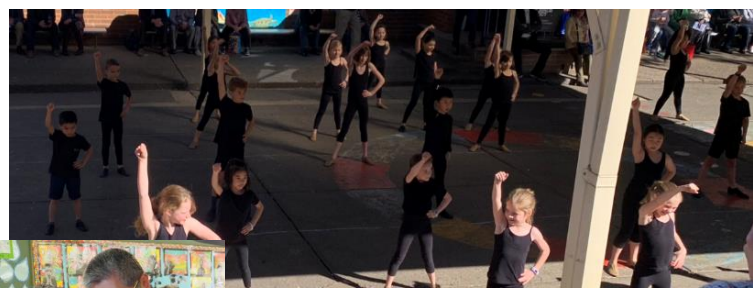
Canteen Mural - Wow!

Swim Scheme 2019

Years 3-6 Students

Term 3 Week 9 and 10

Monday 16 September to Friday 27 September

The Department of Education School Swimming and Water Safety Program is an intensive learn-to-swim program, which develops water confidence and provides students with basic skills in water safety and survival. The program is conducted over ten days. Each daily lesson is 45 minutes.

All Year 2 students will participate in this program. We encourage any Years 3-6 students who have not reached a satisfactory standard of water safety and survival skills, and are unable to swim 25m confidently unaided in deep water, to participate in the School Swimming and Water Safety Program. The program focuses on weak swimmers in Year 3 to 6, as well as students with special needs such as new arrivals in Australia and students with disabilities.

The cost of the program is \$30 and will take place at school.

This program is an excellent opportunity for students to improve their confidence and water safety skills.

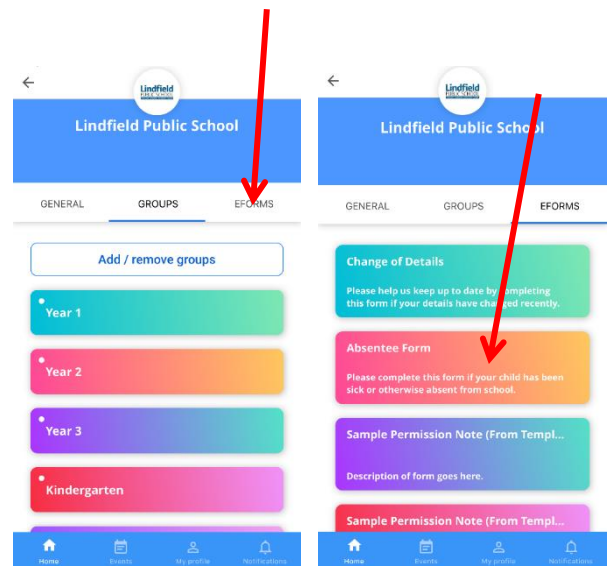

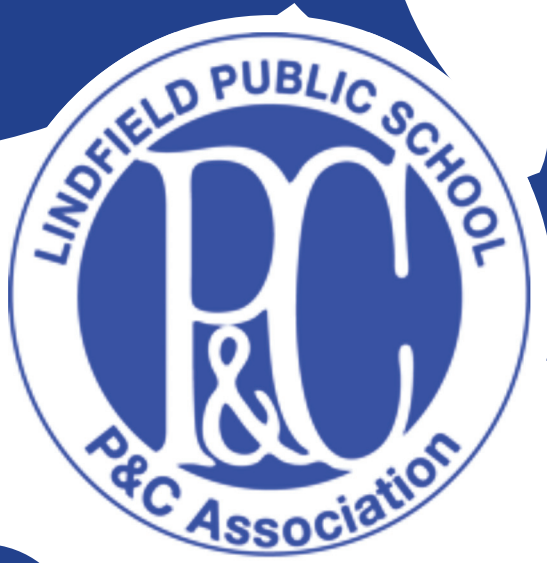

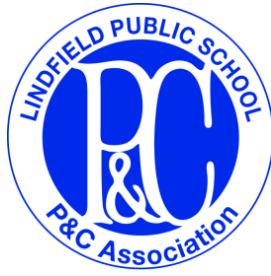

Also, our Senior Girls will compete in the playoffs against Summer Hill PS and Neutral Bay PS next Sunday down at St George Leagues. Go go Girls!

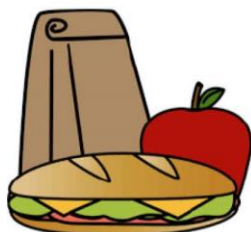

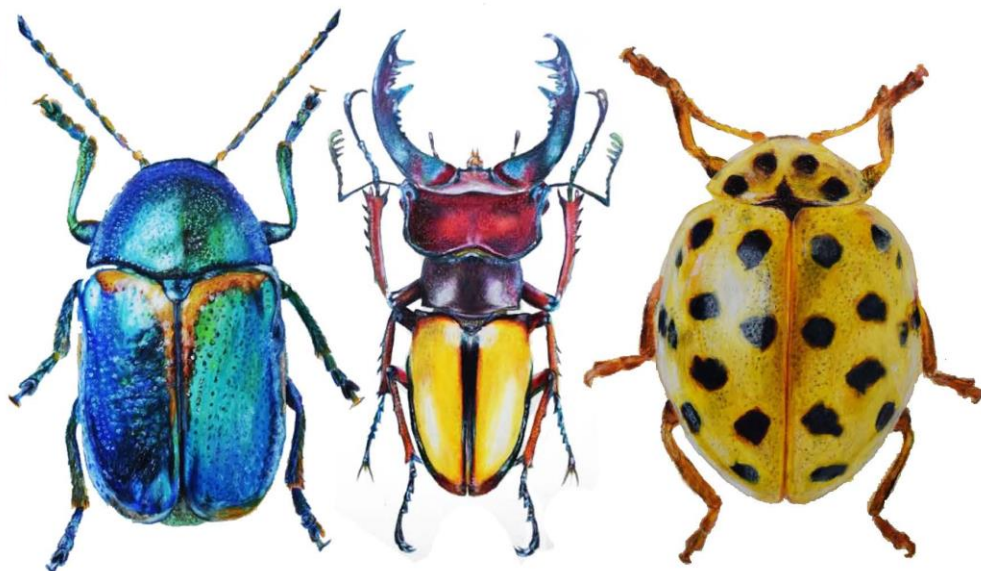
