Principal's Message

What a Storm!

Changes in Family Circumstances

Sadly sometimes relationships break down and the court makes orders that change the contact parents can have with their children or the role they play in making decisions about their children's education. These can be Family Court Orders or Apprehended Violence Orders. Parents can also reach agreement about issues such as contact in a parenting plan.

If this happens it is important that you provide the school with a copy of any court orders or plan that could impact on your child's education.

In the absence of any notification to the contrary, the school will assume that both parents continue to retain a shared and equal parental responsibility for their children and should be involved in making any decisions regarding their children's education. This means that the school will recognise that each parent has equal duties, obligations, responsibilities and opportunities in relation to matters involving the school.

If any changes occur in your family relationships which have the potential to impact on the relationship between the school and your family, please advise the school immediately and provide a copy of any court orders that may be obtained. These orders will be stored securely and only accessed by staff who need to see them in order to plan for your children's learning and support and related issues.

Please contact the office and ask for a 'Change in Family Circumstances' form which allows you to update addresses, contact numbers, emergency contacts and court orders. The form can also be found under the Notes tab on the school website. This information is vital for us to ensure that we have the most up to date contact information in case your child suffers from an illness or accident.

Killara Schools Partnership Year 3 History Enrichment Workshop

Year 3 students from across the KSP visited Killara HS on Tuesday 19 November to travel back in time 2500 years to learn about the groovy gods and goddesses of Ancient Greece. We discovered the landscape and terrain of Ancient Greece, including the home of the gods and goddesses, Mount Olympus. Students discovered the special powers of Zeus, Athena, Aphrodite, Hera, Hestia, Poseidon and Hades, deciding who to pray to. We investigated how consulting the Delphic Oracle assisted the Ancient Greeks in how to make important decisions in their daily lives. They worked in small groups with Year 9 Elective History students to create and design their own gods and goddesses, sharing their creations special powers and symbols with students from other schools.

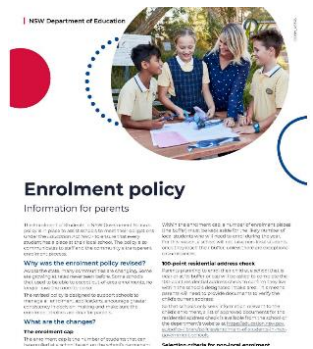

From this term, all new applicants are required to provide 100 points as a residential check and non-local enrolments cannot be accepted if a school has reached its capacity (cap). At Lindfield PS we have reached our cap and will continue to take only in- area (local) enrolments.

2020 School Travel Applications Now Open



To assist with any enquiries you may receive regarding student travel applications, we have provided some information below.

Applications for student travel in 2020 opened on Friday, 11 October 2019.

Students progressing to year 3 and year 7 no longer need to re-apply *if* they:

- are continuing at the same school
- are residing at the same address
- have *not* been sent an expiry notification from Transport for NSW.

Where a student meets the new distance eligibility, the system will automatically update their entitlement. If they do not meet the new eligibility, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students who have an entitlement approved under a medical condition which is due to expire will receive a notification advising them to re-apply.

Term Bus Pass holders will receive a notification to re-apply.

If students need to update their information or re-apply, they should go online to <https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/updateDetails>

Applications need to be submitted before 31 December 2019 to ensure student entitlements are updated and their current entitlement/card is not cancelled. If their application is submitted after 31 December 2019, the system will automatically cancel an entitlement/card and a new one will need to be issued.

Students in the Opal network applying for a SSTS or Term Bus Pass entitlement for the first time will receive their card at their nominated postal address. Cards will be mailed out from January 2020.

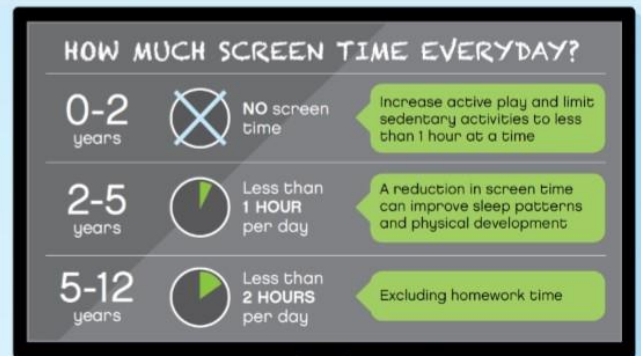
