#### Class Parents - We need you!

Thank you to the wonderful parents who have already volunteered to be a class parent. If you are interested in taking on this role, please return your Expression of Interest form to your classroom teacher as soon as possible. Please see the Expression of Interest form later in the Lines for details about being a Class Parent.

#### Supervision and 'Kiss and Drop'

Please note that teacher supervision commences at 8:30am. Students must not be at school before this time unless they are at Lindfield Activity Centre, Swimming or under the direct supervision of a parent/carer. This is to ensure student safety and for Child Protection reasons. Students should arrive at school between 8:30am and 8:55am. Students who arrive at school after 9:00am must report to the front office accompanied by a parent/carer to be given a late arrival note. This note should be given to the class teacher.

In the afternoon, it is expected that students are collected from school promptly at 3pm as teacher supervision ceases at this time. For our children's safety, it is expected that students in Kindergarten, Year 1 and 2 are collected from their classrooms. Students must leave school promptly and are not permitted to play in

the playground unsupervised. Students are not allowed to wait in the playground for an after school activity as there is no supervision. Please assist us by collecting your children promptly or reminding them to leave school when the bell goes.

We are trying to encourage students to be independent in the mornings and be ready to start lessons as



soon as the bell goes. Please assist us by 'kissing and dropping' your child in the playground and then leaving. This is especially important in the K-2 Maple Playground area as we are such a big school that we don't have room for parents/carers to wait around for the children to begin classes. Thank you for your cooperation in ensuring we all work together to keep our students safe.

# Raising Kids &Teens in a Screen World

Dr Kristy Goodwin a digital parenting educator, author and researcher (& mum who also deals with her kids' techno-tantrums), delivers research-based information to parents about the overwhelming and confusing task of raising young kids and adolescents in a digital world. Dr Kristy arms parents with simple strategies to manage screen-time at home without tears and tantrums and without having to constantly fret about their online safety. Kristy will explain, why our kids and teens become infatuated (not 'addicted') to technology, why they find it hard to switch off devices (and throw techno-tantrums) and how we can help our kids and teens develop healthy digital habits.

Kirsty will share the current risks to kids' online safety (the 3P's- predators, pornography and peers in the form of cyber-bullying) and will explore why we need to avoid using screen-time as a reward or punishment tool. In this engaging seminar Kristy shares realistic advice about how to ensure screens don't compromise our kids' and teens' physical health (sleep, physical activity, vision, hearing and posture), emotional health (cyber-bullying, cyber-safety, use of social media) and learning (the academic costs of multi-tasking). Kristy empowers parents with simple ideas and strategies to help them be the pilot of the digital plane.





Please note, no students are allowed to bring glass bottles to school for safety reason



The Premier's Reading Challenge begins on Monday 2 March and will conclude on Friday 28 August. All students will receive a letter next week during their Library lesson with more information. This is a free, state-wide program available to all NSW schools. Students are encouraged to read a certain number of books depending on their year level from a set list of books. These books can be readily found in our school Library and at local council Libraries.

We strongly encourage your child to take part in this very worthwhile Challenge. It is designed to inspire a love of reading, can help improve literacy skills and exposes children to quality literature. It also helps to support our students to aspire in Library lessons, as part of our wholeschool ROAR expectations, by encouraging our students to read a







wider and diverse range of books. Students who complete the Challenge will be named and congratulated in our school newsletter and Years 3-6 now also have their own 'Wall of Fame' in our school Library! To assist and encourage all K-2 students to take part in the Challenge, books read in class and in Library will be added to student lists by the Teacher Librarian. So please do not be concerned if you see different books added to your child's list that you have not entered yourself.


